





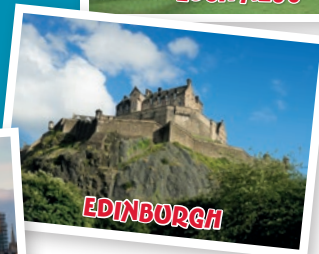
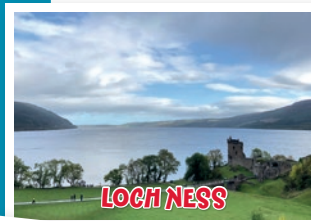

1 Loch Ness

Read.

Loch Ness is home to the Loch Ness Monster. Or 'old' Nessie, as it is known. But every study wants to find out. Loch Ness is the Scottish word for lake. Loch Ness is in the Scottish Highlands, 8 km from the city of Inverness. It is about 30 km long and 2 km wide. It is very deep. Some people think that Nessie 'the aquatic monster' lives at the bottom of this deep water. They say that she looks like a pterosaur, with a long neck and enormous hump. Do you want to see Nessie? Go on a cruise and look for her in the water. Visit the ruins of Urquhart Castle too. This castle was very important in Scotland. King Alexander II built the castle in the 13th century. There is a fantastic view of the loch from the castle. Remember to take your camera on this trip. You might get a photo of Nessie! Imagine that!
