1. **London Parks**

1. **Read.**
London has eight Royal Parks that provide 3500 acres of green space for residents and visitors across the capital. Each park (Hyde Park, Kensington Gardens, Richmond Park, St James Park, The Green Park, The Regent's Park, Greenwich Park, Bushy Park and Victoria Tower Gardens) has got something unique to offer people who want to take a break from busy city life. Having an outdoor space? Then go to Hyde Park for a big open area. The Serpentine. This man-made lake contains no fish and is not treated so as well as people you might have to share the water with a few birds! Do you like flowers? Then you should go to The Regent's Park and visit Queen Mary's Gardens where you can see more than 12,000 roses. You can also walk up Primrose Hill for wonderful views of the city. Interested in astronomy? Then you won't be disappointed at The Greenwich Park. This park has got a Royal Observatory, which is home to the UK's biggest telescope. Don't forget to go and stand on the Meridian line, the reference point for Greenwich Mean Time (GMT), as well. What an experience!
