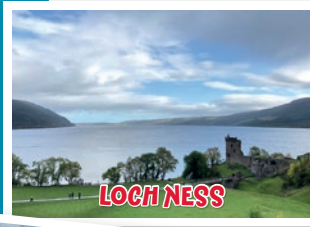
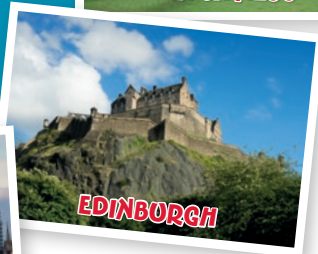

Loch Ness is in the Scottish Highlands, 8 km far from the city of Inverness. It is about 30 kilometers long and 2 kilometers deep. Some people think that Nessie 'the aquatic monster' lives at the bottom of this deep water. They say that she looks like a plesiosaur, with a long neck and enormous humps. Do you want to see Nessie? Go on a cruise and look for her in the water. Visit the ruins of Urquhart Castle too. This castle was very important in Scottish history. King Alexander II built the castle in the 13th century.
