1. Read

Loch Ness is home to the Loch Ness Monster. Or is it? Nobody knows. But everybody wants to find out. Loch is the Scottish word for lake. Loch Ness is in the Scottish Highlands, 30 km from the city of Inverness. It is about 36 kilometers long and 2 kilometers deep. Some people think that Nessie, the aquatic monster hidden at the bottom of this deep water. They say that she looks like a plesiosaur, with a long neck and enormous hump. Do you want to see Nessie? Go on a cruise and look for her in the water. Visit the name of Loch Ness Castle too. The castle was very important in Scottish history. King Alexander II built the castle in the 13th century. There is a fantastic view of the loch from the castle. Remember to take your camera on this trip. You might get a photo of Nessie! Imagine that!
